

> Rae Rippetoe-Blair Head Basketball Coach (Oklahoma State, 1985)

Wins. The trend always continues with head coach Rae Rippetoe Blair. As UTSA head women's basketball coach Rae Rippetoe-Blair enters her seventh year at the helm of the program and her list of accomplishments and records continues to grow. During the 2004-05 season, she became the all-time winningest women's basketball coach in UTSA history and currently owns 99 wins in San Antonio. Since her hire, the Roadrunners have posted six consecutive winning seasons and have made six straight trips to the Southland Conference Tournament, including two SLC finals appearances. Her . 572 winning percentage is second best at UTSA.

UTSA has averaged 16 wins a season over the last six years during RippetoeBlair's tenure in San Antonio. Coach Rippetoe-Blair looks to jump back into the Southland Conference (SLC) winner's circle after winning the league title in 2002-03.

A two-time SLC Coach of the Year, Rippetoe-Blair has posted a record of 9974 at UTSA, with an overall mark of 206-118 in 10 full years as a head coach.

Last season, Rippetoe-Blair and the Roadrunners enjoyed a successful season with an 18-12 mark and a trip back to the SLC Tounrament finals. She tied her career season win total for the second time at UTSA. The Runners finish third in the league with a 11-5 record. Coach Rippetoe-Blair reached a milestone last season, when she recorded her 200th career win on Feb. 2 at Nicholls State.

In her fifth season, Rippetoe-Blair mentored the Roadrunners to a 16-12
 record along with 10 wins in the SLC during the 2004-05 season. Despite again ranking as the top defensive team in the SLC in 2004-05, UTSA was never fully able to put all parts of its attack together with consistency. The Roadrunners finished 16-12 overall and 10-6 in the league, good for a fifth-place finish.

In her fourth season, she led UTSA to the program's first regular season SLC championship with a record of 17-3 and an overall mark of 18-11, Rip-petoe-Blair was honored as the 2002-03 SLC Coach of the Year. The 18 wins were the most wins, she has had at UTSA. The honor was richly deserved after turning around a team that began the season 0-8, and upon entering SLC play won 17 of 19 games, including a school-record 13-game winning streak.

In her third season, Blair received the award for the second time in three years since arriving at UTSA. She was named the 2001 Coach of the Year following a 16-13 season.

Blair's teams have ranked among the best defensively in the country every year. UTSA was ranked in the top six nationally in scoring defense during the 2002-03 and was ranked second in the nation the in her first two seasons (2000-2001 and 2001-2002).

On their way to the regular season 2002-03 SLC crown, the 'Runners set new school-records in conference victories (17), consecutive games won (13) and home court wins (11). While the immediate impact Blair had on the UTSA program might be a surprise, the success should not be. A proven winner as both a head coach at NAIA Phillips University and as an assistant at Oklahoma State University, she has enjoyed continued success.

Blair turned around a Phillips program with a 104-51 mark during her five seasons in Enid, Okla. She was named the Sooner Athletic Conference's 198990 Coach of the Year after a 29-7 record.

Prior to UTSA, Blair was an assistant coach at her alma mater, Oklahoma State, for eight seasons. As a player, Rippetoe left her mark to this day on the

Cowgirl program, ranking in the top 20 in five categories.
As an assistant coach, Blair spent eight seasons building one of the top programs in the Big Eight Conference. During those years in Oklahoma, Blair built some valuable contacts among high school coaches. Her pipeline to Oklahoma has brought former Texas Tech recruit Nikki Hendrix, Piedmont, Okla., standout Lacy Mingee and Katie Sandefur from Kingfisher, Okla., to San Antonio.

Rippetoe-Blair started her coaching career in 1985 as an assistant coach at Southern Nazarene University in Bethany, Okla. She was at SNU for two seasons before moving to Phillips University. After two rebuilding seasons at Phillips, Rip-petoe-Blair coached Phillips to three straight 20-win campaigns. Phillips went 29-7 in 1989-90, earning conference coach of the year honors. In 1990-91, Phillips was 23-8 and 20-9 in her final season at Phillips before returning to Oklahoma State.

As an Ardmore (Okla.) High School athlete, she ran on the 1980 state champion mile relay team. She played on the 1980 Oklahoma-Texas AllStar team and was an all-state pick in track and basketball. She was the team's MVP in softball and was named the outstanding female Athlete of the Year for Ardmore High.

Born May 21, 1962, in Altus, Okla., Blair has been married to banker Craig Blair the past 16 years. They reside in Fair Oaks Ranch, Texas. Was a member of the Kappa Delta Sorority at Oklahoma State.

Lichonczak begins his 27th year of college coaching this fall. Previously, he was the head coach at Radford University from 1990 to 2001, where he guided the Highlanders to six conference titles and the NCAA Tournament in 1994, 1995 and 1996. He served as an assistant coach at Texas A\&M, Old Dominion, Ohio State and Idaho before his Radford stint.

At Texas A\&M he worked with current UTSA Athletic Director Lynn Hickey from 1987 to 1990, serving as the scouting and recruiting coordinator and had floor coaching responsibilities. At Old Dominion he helped lead the Monarchs to the Sun Belt Conference title in 1987 and the NCAA Tournament. At Ohio State, OSU was the Big Ten Conference champion four consecutive years, from 1982-85. Lichonczak began his coaching career where he received his bachelor's degree in education, at Idaho. The Vandals were
 AIAW Division II Tournament participants in 1980.

This past summer Luby serviced as the advance scout for the Women's National Basketball Asscoiation (WNBA) Indiana Fever.

The Big South Conference Coach of the Year in 1992, Lichonczak received his master's degree in athletic administration from Ohio State in 1985.


Former UTSA standout, Amber Prose begins her fifth year on the coaching staff, after serving as a volunteer assistant in 2002-03. Prose is in charge of recuiting, guard instruction, while assisting with scouting and special situations.
The Seward County Community College product lettered two years as the Roadrunners point guard and led the team in steals and assists both of her years with UTSA.

A two-year starter at Seward County, Prose helped the Saints to a No. 1 ranking before finishing with a 33-1 record in 2000. In 1999 they posted a 34-4 record on the way to a No. 5 national ranking.

A native of Little River, Kan., she was a two-year starter at UTSA. During her stint, she collected 117 assists and totaled 325 points. As a Roadrunner, she helped the team to back-to-back winning seasons during the 2000-01 and 2001-2002 sea-
 sons.


# Courtney Locke Assistant Coach (Rutgers 2006) 

Courtney Locke joins the UTSA coaching staff after playing for Rutgers from 2002-2006. She appeared in 123 games, while making 26 starts for the Scarlet Knights. Some of Locke's duties as coach include setting up community services events, handling the UTSA camps, recruiting and corresponding with Texas AAU coaches and San Antonio high schools coaches.

The San Marcos, Texas, native was a member of Rugters' 2005 Elite Eight and 2006 Sweet 16 teams. During the 2005-06 season, the Scarlet Knights were the Big East Conference Regular Season Champions and they advanced to the NCAA Tournament all four of her seasons.

Locke earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science \& sports studies from Rutgers in May 2006.


## Dakota Cowgill Director of Basketball Operations (Briar Cliff Univ./2004)

Dakota Cowgill is in his second season at UTSA as the Director of Women's Basketball Operations. A former basketball player at Briar Cliff University from 2000-04, Cowgill was twice an Academic All-American. The Grand Island, Neb., native is in charge of team travel, film exchange, compliance, alunmni correspondance and overseeing the managers.

Cowgill resides in San Antonio, with his wife, Mariah, and son, Camden.


## Katie Sandefur Student Assistant Coach (UTSA 2006)

After a successful four-tenure as part of the women's basketball team, Katie Sandefur joins the staff as a student assistant coach this season. A four-year starter for coach Rae Rippetoe-Blair, Sandefur helped her team win the Southland Conference Regular Season Championship during the 2003-2003 seson, a season. The Kingfisher, Okla., native ranks 14th on the all-time scoring list with 782 points and is 10th with 473 career rebounds. She is the all-time leader with 115 career games played at UTSA.

Sandefur is finishing her undergraduate degree in education and plans to become a teacher after graduation.
