

Rae Rippetoe-Blair Head Basketball Coach (Oklahoma State, 1985)

Beginning her eighth season as head coach of the UTSA women's basketball team, Rae Rippetoe-Blair has established herself as the winningest and longest tenured head coach in UTSA history. Rippetoe-Blair looks to jump back into the Southland Conference (SLC) winner's circle after winning the league title in 2002-03.

Since her hiring in 2000, the Roadrunners have made the Southland Conference Tournament seven consecutive seasons, including two trips to the conference finals (2003 and 2006). During the 2004-05 season, she became the all-time winningest women's basketball coach in UTSA history. She currently owns 113 wins, is the only women's coach with more than 100 career victories at UTSA and her .557 winning percentage is second-

best in UTSA. The Roadrunners have the second-most SLC wins (85) and second-best winning percentage (.685) since 2001.

A two-time SLC Coach of the Year, Rippetoe-Blair has posted a record of 113-90 at UTSA, with an overall mark of 220-134 in 11 full years as a head coach. UTSA has averaged 16 wins a season the last seven years.

Last season, the Roadrunners finished 14-16 overall and 9-7 in SLC play. Rippetoe-Blair collected her 100th UTSA career victory on Nov. 24 with a 77-67 win against Eastern Washington. UTSA finished its conference season in a three-way tie for fourth place and earned the No. 5 seed at the 2007 SLC Conference Tournament. The Roadrunners

pulled an upset win against Southeastern Louisiana in the first round before falling to top-seeded UT Arlington in the semifinals.

During the 2005-06 season, Rippetoe-Blair and the Roadrunners enjoyed a successful season with an 18-12 mark and a trip back to the SLC Tournament finals. She tied her career season win total for the second time at UTSA. The Runners finish third in the league with an 11-5 record and she recorded her 200th career win on Feb. 2 at Nicholls State.

In her fifth season, Rippetoe-Blair mentored the Roadrunners to a 16-12 record along with 10 wins in SLC play. UTSA was the league's top defense, in holding opponents to just 57.8 points per game.

Rippetoe-Blair led UTSA to the program's first regular season SLC Championship with a record of 17-3 and an overall mark of 18-11 in 2002-03. Rippetoe-Blair was honored as the SLC Coach



of the Year. The honor was richly deserved after turning around a team that began the season 0-8, and upon entering SLC play, won 17 of 19 games, including a school-record 13-game winning streak. The 17 SLC wins was also a school record that season.

In her third season, Blair received the Coach of the Year honor for the second time in three years following a 16-12 season.

Blair's teams have been ranked among the best defensive teams in the country. UTSA was ranked in the top six nationally in scoring defense during 2002-03 and was ranked second in the nation in her first two seasons (2000-01 and 2001-02).

On their way to the 2002-03 SLC crown, the 'Runners set school records for conference victories (17), consecutive games won (13) and home court wins (11). While the immediate impact Blair had on the UTSA program might be a surprise, the success should not be. A proven winner as both a head coach at NAIA Phillips University and as an assistant at Oklahoma State, she has enjoyed continued success.

Blair turned around a Phillips program with a 104-51 mark during her five seasons in Enid, Okla. She was named the Sooner Athletic Conference's 1989-90 Coach of the Year after a 29-7 record.

Prior to UTSA, Blair was an assistant coach at her alma mater, Oklahoma State, for eight seasons. As a player, Rip-

petoe left her mark to this day on the Cowgirls program, ranking in the top 20 in five categories.

As an assistant coach, she helped build Oklahoma State as one of the top programs in the Big Eight Conference and made valuable contacts among high school coaches. Her pipeline to Oklahoma has brought former Texas Tech recruit Nikki Hendrix, former standouts Lacy Mingee and Katie Sandefur to San Antonio. Coach Rippetoe-Blair continues to bring excellent recruits from the state of Oklahoma. Most recent additions are Monica Gibbs from Stillwater, Kara McKay from Rush Springs, and Jordan Stark from Weatherford.

Rippetoe-Blair started her coaching career in 1985 as an assistant coach at Southern Nazarene University in Bethany, Okla. She was at SNU for two seasons before moving to Phillips University. After two rebuilding sea-

sons at Phillips, Rippetoe-Blair coached three straight 20win teams. Phillips went 29-7 in 1989-90, as Rippetoe-Blair earned conference coach of the year honors. In 1990-91, Phillips was 23-8 and 20-9 in her final season before returning to Oklahoma State.

As an Ardmore (Okla.) High School athlete, she ran on the 1980 state champion mile relay team. She played on the 1980 Oklahoma-Texas All-Star team and was an all-state pick in track and basketball. She was the team's MVP in softball and was named the outstanding female Athlete of the Year for Ardmore High.

Born May 21, 1962, in Altus, Okla., Blair has been married to banker Craig Blair the past 16 years. They reside in Fair Oaks Ranch, Texas. She was a member of the Kappa Delta Sorority at Oklahoma State.


Lubomyr Lichonczak Associate Head Coach (Idaho 1978)

ubomyr "Luby" Lichonczak begins his sixth season at UTSA and third season as associate head women's basketball coach. He serves

as the scouting coordinator, team's academic liaison and assists with scheduling and recruiting.

Lichonczak begins his 29th year of college coaching this fall. Over the summer, he was an assistant coach for the Nigerian national team. Previously, he was the head coach at Radford University from 1990-2001, where he guided the Highlanders to six conference titles and three NCAA Tournament appearances from 1994-96. He served as an assistant coach at Ohio State for five seasons, where he helped guide the Buckeyes to four Big Ten Conference titles. Lichonczak also has served as an assistant coach at Texas A&M, Old Dominion and Idaho.


At Texas A&M, he worked with current UTSA Athletic Director Lynn Hickey from 1987-90, serving as the scouting and recruiting coordinator and assisted with floor coaching responsibilities. At Old Dominion, he helped lead the Monarchs to the Sun Belt Conference title in 1987 and the NCAA Tournament. At



Ohio State, he helped the Buckeyes win the Big Ten Conference Champion four consecutive years from 1982-85. Lichonczak began his coaching career at his alma mater Idaho. The Vandals were AIAW Division II Tournament participants in 1980.

This past summer, Lichonczak served as the advance scout for the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Indiana Fever.

The Big South Conference Coach of the Year in 1992 at Radford, Lichonczak received his master's degree in athletic administration from Ohio State in 1985.









Courtney Locke Assistant Coach (Rutgers 2006)

ourtney Locke begins her second season as an assistant coach at UTSA after playing for Rutgers from 2002-06. She appeared in 123 games, while making 26 starts for the Scarlet Knights. Some of Locke's duties as a coach include setting up community services events, handling summer camps, recruiting and corresponding with Texas AAU coaches and San Antonio high schools coaches.

The San Marcos, Texas, native was a member of Rutgers' 2005 Elite Eight and 2006 Sweet 16 teams. During the 2005-06 season, the Scarlet Knights were the Big East Conference Regular Season Champions and they advanced to the NCAA Tournament all four of her seasons.

Locke earned her bachelor's degree in exercise science & sports studies from Rutgers in May 2006.



Koty Cowgill Director of Basketball Operations (Briar Cliff Univ./2004)

oty Cowgill is in his third season at UTSA as the Director of Women's Basketball Operations at UTSA. A former basketball player at Briar Cliff University from 2000-04, Cowgill was twice an Academic All-American. The Grand Island, Neb., native is in charge of team travel, film exchange, compliance, alumni correspondence and overseeing the team's managers.







Brenna Ellis Associate Athletics Trainer (Indiana State/1998)

Brenna Ellis is in her second season as Associate Athletics Trainer and seventh year overall at UTSA. She handles the medical services for the women's basketball, soccer and softball teams. Recently, Ellis was appointed to the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports. She also serves on Southwest Athletic Trainers Association College and University of Athletic Trainers' Committee and is the Sports Sciences Coordinator for NCAA postseason championships in San Antonio.

Ellis spent one year as an assistant athletics trainer at Towson and was in charge of medical services for the women's basketball, volleyball, softball and field hockey sports programs. She was a graduate assistant at Arkansas from 1998-2000, where she received her master's degree of science. She received her undergraduate degree from Indiana State in 1998.






