Season Outlook

The 2013-14 UTSA women's basketball team will dive head first into a new conference for the second straight year with a new head coach and only seven returning players from last season's 16-15 squad.

First-year head coach Luby Lichonczak, who has spent the past 11 years as an assistant for the Roadrunners, the final nine as the program's associate head coach will take over looking to make a mark in the new-look Conference USA.

UTSA returns seven letterwinners and two starters from last year's team that finished 16-14 overall and 10-8 in the Western Athletic Conference. The Roadrunners finished fourth in the WAC standings after being picked to finish eighth in the preseason media poll and ninth in the coaches' rankings.

UTSA will be competing in its third conference in as many seasons after officially joining Conference USA on July 1, 2013. The Roadrunners competed as members of the Southland Conference from 1992-2012 before joining the WAC a year ago.

Kamra King returns to the fold after leading UTSA in scoring each of the last two seasons. The Norman, Okla., native averaged 9.3 points per game in 2012-13 after scoring 10.4 per outing as a freshman. In addition to King, the Birds return starting point guard Miki Turner, along with forward Mannasha Bell and reserves Ashley Spaletta and Niaga Mitchell-Cole.

Lichonczak welcomes an infusion of youth with seven freshman joining the program in 2013. Look for an immediate impact from guards Alana Heard and Dwanisha Tate as well as from center Tesha Smith, a San Antonio native from Wagner High School.

UTSA has been picked to finish 15th by league coaches in the 16-team league but Lichonczak believes his squad has the ability to far exceed the preseason sentiment from the outside bettor on them.

Lichonczak will rely heavily on his veteran backcourt of King, Spaletta, and Turner. The talented trio, along with forwards Bell and Mitchell-Cole, should provide a great deal of knowledge and experience that should aid in the development of this young team.

In addition to a host of new players, the Roadrunners will welcome new members to Lichonczak's coaching staff. Kristen Holt will take over Lichonczak's vacated associate head coach position. Most recently the head coach at Colorado State, Holt is a former assistant of Lichonczak's at Radford. Deidra Johnson returns as assistant coach and will be joined by Roadrunner alum Nicole Dunson (2005). Emily Sherman enters her second season as director of operations.

Junior (2012-13)

Appeared in 28 games (21 starts) ... averaged 6.1 points, 2.1 rebounds, 1.7 assists, 1.2 steals and 23.9 minutes per game ... improved those averages to 7.4 points, 2.4 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 25.5 minutes during Western Athletic Conference play ... shot 39.9 percent from the floor and 34.3 percent from behind the 3-point arc, both of which were tops among the guards ... reached double-figure scoring eight times, including six such games during league action ... scored a season-high 16 points against Louisiana Tech (Feb. 7) and recorded a season-best six rebounds at Seattle (March 2) ... helped UTSA to a win over San Jose State (March 7) with a season-high seven assists.

Prior To UTSA

Played in 58 contests and helped lead the Buccaneers to a 40-23 record over two seasons at Blinn College ... averaged 11.5 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 1.3 steals per game as a sophomore ... an All-Region XIV honoree and was awarded Blinn's Don Wilhelm Award, which is given to a women's basketball player who excels both on the court and in the classroom ... also shot 38 percent from the field and led the team with 87 free throws that season ... scored a career-high 28 points on 11-of-

17 shooting against Lon Morris ... posted averages of 5.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 1.9 assists per contest as a freshman ... a four-year starter for head coach Nancy Faulk at MacArthur High School in Houston ... earned first-team All-District 5A-19 as a junior and senior ... in addition, she earned academic all-district honors and was named the team's Most Valuable Player and Defensive Player of the Year as a senior ... a member of the honors society and earned the school's T.A.F.E. scholarship.

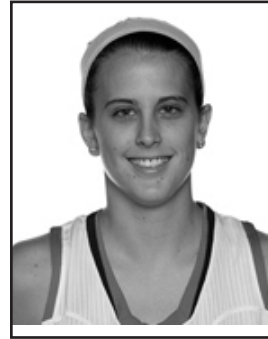

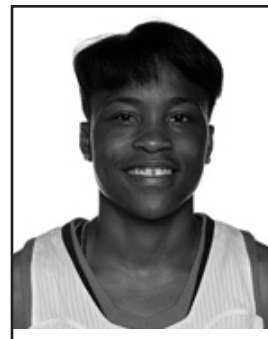

LUBOMYR LICHONCZAK

Idaho • 1985
Record at UTSA: First Season
Career Record: 151-151 (.500), 11 yrs.

UTSA Athletics Director Lynn Hickey announced the hiring of Lubomyr "Luby" Lichonczak as the eighth head women's basketball coach in the program's history on Aug. 28, 2013.

"I'm excited to have someone with the wealth of coaching experience and knowledge of our program that Luby possesses," Hickey said. "He has coached at significant programs around the country along with some outstanding service in the professional ranks. As a member of my coaching staff for several years at Texas A&M, I have first-hand knowledge of his values, his desire to help our students grow and become successful on and off the court as well as his passion for the sport."

"First, I would like to thank my family, who has continuously supported me throughout my career, and all of the numerous players, coaches and administrators that have helped me along the way," Lichonczak said. "I also would like to thank President Dr. Ricardo Romo, Athletics Director Lynn Hickey and Associate Athletics Director Tamica Smith-Jones for giving me this wonderful opportunity."

"I believe that our university athletic environment can be a classroom for life in educating the whole person, mind, body, heart and spirit. Working with young people in an educational and competitive environment is an important undertaking and a challenge and I look forward to facing this challenge with hard work, intensity, caring and enthusiasm."

Lichonczak has spent 11 years on the Roadrunners' coaching staff, including the last nine as the associate head coach. He was hired at UTSA prior to the 2002-03 season and spent two campaigns as an assistant before being promoted to associate head coach. Lichonczak primarily worked with the post players and served as the program's scouting coordinator and team academic liaison and assisted with scheduling and recruiting.

During his time on the UTSA bench he helped mentor 23 all-conference selections – including seven first-team All-Southland Conference picks – one Southland Player

and Defensive Player of the Year (Monica Gibbs/2009), three Southland Newcomers of the Year (Dwella Holliday, 2003/Vivian Ewalefo, 2006/Onika Anderson, 2008) and a pair of Southland Freshmen of the Year (Richelle Parks, 2005/Monica Gibbs, 2006).

He was instrumental in helping UTSA win back-to-back Southland Tournament Championships to earn the program's only NCAA Tournament appearances in 2008 and '09. The 2008-09 squad posted a school-record 24 wins and became the first No. 15-seed in the history of the NCAA Division I Championship to take a No. 2-seed to overtime.

In addition to the squad's accomplishments on the court, Lichonczak aided several student-athletes in the classroom. Ryba Pawlaczyk earned ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District IV, Southland Student-Athlete of the Year and first-team Southland All-Academic in 2009, while Nicole Dunson took home the league's Student-Athlete of the Year and first-team all-academic honors in 2005.

Lichonczak came to the Alamo City after spending the 2001-02 campaign as the associate head coach at Colorado State where he helped the Rams to a 24-7 mark, including a 12-2 league record en route to the Mountain West Regular Season Championship and an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament.

His stint in Fort Collins came after an 11-year run as the head coach at Radford (1990-2001). Lichonczak coached the Highlanders to a 151-151 (.500) overall record and 99-53 (.651) mark in Big South Conference games. His 151 wins rank second in program annals.

Under his guidance, Radford claimed six consecutive Big South Tournament titles (1991-96) and made three straight NCAA Tournament appearances (1994-96). Lichonczak earned Big South Coach of the Year honors in 1992 after the squad posted a 20-9 record and 11-1 league ledger en route to a conference regular-season title.

Lichonczak was an assistant under Hickey at Texas A&M from 1987-90 after a pair of seasons (1985-87) at Old Dominion, where he helped the Monarchs to the 1987 Sun Belt Conference Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth. Prior to his time in Norfolk, Va., Lichonczak was an assistant at Ohio State from 1980-85 and aided the Buckeyes to four consecutive Big Ten titles (1982-85) and NCAA Tournament appearances in 1982, '84 and '85. The 1985 squad finished the season with a 26-2 record, 18-0 Big Ten mark and advanced to the Elite Eight before falling to Old Dominion,

Lichonczak, who earned a bachelor of science degree in social studies and education from Idaho in 1978 and a master of arts degree in athletic administration from Ohio State in 1985, and his wife, Maryann, have a son, Yov, and a daughter, Nika.

KRISTEN HOLT

Ohio • 1992
First Season

Kristen Holt is in her first season as UTSA's associate head coach.

"Anytime you can get someone with this much coaching experience on your staff it really helps because she's been in these situations and can anticipate the needs and wants of our program," head coach Luby Lichonczak said when he announced her hiring. "Kristen is someone I've known for a long time, beginning with our days together at Radford. She has such a pleasant personality and is very welcoming and inviting. She displays great integrity and faith and will be a great role model for our student-athletes."

Holt most recently was the head coach at Colorado State from 2008-2012 where her Rams teams consistently moved up the Mountain West Conference (MWC) standings, including a 9-5 record and third-place finish in 2011-12. The 9-5 mark was the highest MWC finish for CSU since 2003-04. Holt took over the head coaching role following the 2007-08 season on an interim basis before having the interim tag removed following the 2008-09 season. Kim Mestdagh (first team), Sam Marting (second team) and Meghan Heimstra (Sixth Woman of the Year) each earned All-MWC recognition during Holt's final season in Fort Collins. In addition to her coaching duties, she organized Colorado State's High Hoops Club, a 90-member women's basketball booster club.

Prior to being promoted to the interim head coach position, Holt spent the 2007-08 season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Rams.

Holt came to Fort Collins from Wichita State, where she served on Jane Albright's staff from 2003-07. Holt assisted in all aspects of recruiting, scouting, film breakdown and the planning of summer bas-

ketball camps for the Shockers. Holt also coordinated the Shockers High Hoops Club and the Jane's Gems Kids Club.

Before her time in Wichita, Holt served on Lichonczak's coaching staff at Radford from 1995-2001 as an assistant coach. She was promoted to interim head coach during the 2001-02 season and earned 2002 Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors. As an assistant, Holt was responsible for recruiting, team travel, film exchange and the organization of summer camps. In addition, she organized the team's involvement with the community and local youth. In her first two seasons as an assistant, Radford won the Big South Conference Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Highlanders also placed second in the nation for team GPA in 2000-01.

Holt began her coaching career at Xavier in 1993-94 and helped guide the Musketeers to a Midwestern Collegiate Conference Championship.

Holt entered the coaching ranks following a distinguished playing career at Ohio, where she was a four-year letterwinner, two-year captain and part of the 1988 Mid-American Conference All-Freshman Team.

As a senior at Bath High School in Lima, Ohio, Holt was named first-team All-Ohio and the Class AA State Tournament MVP in 1987 after leading the Wildcats to the state title. Holt also was a 1987 AAU All-American.

She graduated from Ohio with a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1992 and completed her master's degree in athletic administration a year later.

Former Roadrunners guard Nicole Dunson is in her first season as an assistant coach at UTSA.

She is tasked with mentoring returning third-team All-Western Athletic Conference selection Kamra King and host of others in Luby Lichonczak's first season in charge of the program.

"Anytime you can get a student-athlete and leader the caliber of Nicole to come back into your program, it is a win-win for everyone," Lichonczak said when he announced her hiring. "She is an exceptional leader, both on the floor and in the classroom, and is a wonderful addition to our program. Nicole was an incredible shooter during her time here and she really understands the game."

"I am excited to have the opportunity to come back to UTSA and work with Coach Lichonczak and the current players," Dunson said. "I have admired Luby since I played at UTSA and am excited to have a chance to learn from him and continue to develop the Roadrunners women's basketball program."

Dunson has spent the past two seasons as the head girl's varsity basketball coach at Richard King High School in Corpus Christi. She led her team to the 2011-12 District 28-5A Championship and a berth in the state playoffs both years. The Corpus Christi native also was selected to coach in the 2013 CBCA All-Star Game.

Dunson spent the previous four seasons at the helm of San Antonio's Harlandale High School girl's basketball program. She also served as the head junior varsity track & field coach in addition to being a health and physical education teacher.

Dunson began her coaching career in 2006 as the

head coach for the girl's U-14 Shooting Stars Basketball AAU program.

After transferring to UTSA following two seasons at Central Florida, Dunson sat out the 2002-03 campaign per NCAA transfer rules, as well as the following year with a right knee injury.

She was an immediate producer in her inaugural season with the Roadrunners, averaging 8.8 points per game and shooting .419 from behind the 3-point line. Following her senior season, Dunson was named the 2005-06 Southland Conference Women's Basketball Student-Athlete of the Year.

She graduated from UTSA with a biology degree in 2005 and went on to receive her master's in education with an emphasis in sports psychology two years later.



Assistant Coach

DEIDRA JOHNSON

Oklahoma State • 2004
Second Season

Deidra Johnson will begin her second season as an assistant coach at UTSA this fall. She works with both the guards and post players.

In her inaugural season on the Roadrunners bench, Johnson helped UTSA lead the Western Athletic Conference in scoring defense (57.7 ppg) and field goal percentage defense (.379), while the Birds ranked fourth in blocks (3.4) and steals (9.7) per game. Under Johnson's tutelage, Whitney Wright led the team with 39 blocks to set the school's all-time record (105), while Kamra King earned third-team all-conference honors after leading the team in scoring (9.3 ppg) for the second consecutive season.

Johnson came to UTSA after spending the previous two seasons as an assistant coach at Marshall, where she also served as the recruiting coordinator during the 2011-12 campaign. In addition to her duties as recruiting coordinator, Johnson coached the guards and the group accounted for the top six scorers on the team. The unit also hit 32 percent of its 3-point attempts, which led Conference USA, and the group helped the Thundering Herd hold their opponents to just 56.1 points per game by averaging 10.5 steals per contest.

Johnson mentored the team's post players in her first season, including Tynikki Crook, who was named second-team all-conference after leading the circuit in scoring at 16.2 ppg.

Prior to her time at Marshall, she spent a total of three seasons at the junior college level.

Before departing after a pair of seasons at Chipola (Fla.) College, Johnson signed the No. 3 recruiting

class in the country and coached 10 players that earned Division I scholarships and three that went on to play professionally, including Latoya Williams, recently of the WNBA's San Antonio Silver Stars. She also coached guards and helped coordinate recruiting during the 2007-08 season at Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College.

Johnson began her collegiate career at the University of Arkansas-Fort Smith, where she was named first-team All-NJCAA Region VI and first-team All-NJCAA Bi-State East. After graduating with an associate's degree in 2002, she continued her playing career at Oklahoma State the next two seasons. The McNeil, Ark., native earned a spot on the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll and National Dean's List before graduating with a bachelor's degree in sociology in 2004.

Sherman graduated from St. Norbert College in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in media communications with a minor in leadership, before earning her master's degree in higher education administration and a minor in sport management from Texas A&M in 2011.

While at Texas A&M, Sherman interned with the athletics department and 12th Man Foundation. Her responsibilities with the 12th Man Foundation included ticketing operations for the men's and women's tennis teams, while serving as a liaison between the squads and the athletics department compliance and marketing staffs. She managed student workers at all matches and assisted with the 2011 NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds that were played in College Station.

From 2007-09, Sherman served as an assistant girls basketball coach at her alma mater, Notre Dame Academy in Green Bay. As an assistant coach on the varsity team in 2009 the squad went 20-6 and advanced to the state semifinals, while the junior varsity team that she assisted the previous season went 16-4.

A standout multi-sport athlete, Sherman lettered in basketball, softball and volleyball at Notre Dame Academy. She was named a team captain for the basketball squad as a senior and led the Lady Tritons to a 21-6 mark and a runner-up finish at the Wisconsin Division II State Tournament.

She is the daughter of Mike and Karen Sherman and has four siblings: sisters, Sarah and Selena, and brothers, Matthew and Benjamin. Her father currently is the offensive coordinator for the Miami Dolphins and former head coach of the Green Bay Packers (2000-05) and Texas A&M (2008-11), while her brother-in-law, Zac Taylor, is the Dolphins' assistant quarterbacks coach.

University President

DR. RICARDO ROMO

Texas • 1967

Ricardo Romo is the fifth president of The University of Texas at San Antonio, one of the fastest growing institutions of higher education in Texas and the nation. During his tenure as president, which began in May 1999, UTSA has become an institution of first choice for students seeking a university degree.

Under his leadership, student enrollment has risen to more than 31,000, representing 68 percent growth in enrollment. The university has added numerous programs and facilities to enhance student life and expand its research capacity. UTSA was named one of the state's emerging research universities by the Texas Legislature with annual research expenditures of \$56 million and sponsored program expenditures of \$70 million for fiscal year 2010, representing a six-fold increase in expenditures during Romo's tenure.

A San Antonio native who grew up on the city's West Side, Romo graduated from Fox Tech High School before attending the University of Texas at Austin on a track scholarship. At UT Austin, he was the first Texan to run the mile in less than four minutes, a record that lasted 41 years.

He earned a bachelor's degree in education from UT Austin (1967) and holds a master's degree in history from Loyola Marymount University (1970). Additionally, Romo earned a Ph.D. in history from the University of California, Los Angeles (1975). A nationally respected urban historian, Romo is the author of "East Los Angeles: History of a Barrio," now in its ninth printing (one in Spanish).

Romo began his academic career teaching social studies from 1967 to 1970 at Franklin High School in Los Angeles. He went on to teach at the University of California at San Diego (1975-1979) and the University of Texas at Austin (1980-1999). He was a visiting professor at University of California, Berkeley in 1985 and visiting scholar with the Stanford University Center for Advanced Studies in Behavioral Sciences (1989-1990). In 1993, he became vice provost for undergraduate education at UT Austin before becoming president of UTSA in 1999.

Romo has received numerous awards and recognitions including 2006 Outstanding Friar Alumnus from the UT Austin Friar Society and the Isabel la Catolica award, the highest award given to non-Spanish subjects, bestowed upon him in 2007 by King Juan Carlos of Spain. In 2008, Romo received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from the Texas Exes Alumni Association.

In 2010, he received the San Antonio North Chamber Gov. Dolph Briscoe Salute to Excellence Award. In 2011, Romo was presented the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) Chief Executive Leadership Award for transforming UTSA from a regional campus into an emerging Tier One research university. In February 2012, Romo received the Colonel W.T. Bondurant Sr. Distinguished Humanitarian Award from the

San Antonio Academy of Texas Alumni Council.

With a strong commitment to serve the community, Romo has served on a range of regional, national and international boards. He is vice chair of the Southwest Research Institute Board of Directors and on the boards of the American Council of Education, Philosophical Society of Texas, Humanities Texas, Austin Museum of Art and United States-Mexico Commission for Educational and Cultural Exchange (COMEXUS). In May 2011, President Barack Obama appointed Romo to the President's Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanics.

Romo is married to Harriett Romo, a UTSA professor of sociology. She also serves as director of the UTSA Mexico Center and the Bank of America Child and Adolescent Policy Research Institute (CAPRI). Both first-generation college graduates, the Romos have a son, Carlos, who earned degrees from Stanford University and the University of Texas School of Law. Their daughter, Anadelia, a graduate of Princeton University, received a doctoral degree from Harvard University and teaches at Texas State University.

The Romos are avid art collectors. Their private art collection is particularly strong in works on paper by Chicana/o and U.S. Latino artists with a regional focus on Texas and the Southwest. The collection includes works by Luis Jimenez, Carmen Lomas Garza, Cesar Martinez and Vincent Valdez, as well as print suites from Self Help Graphics and Coronado Studio.

A talented photographer, Romo's photos have been included in numerous regional art exhibits including "Havana," a collection of photos taken in Cuba, and "South Africa," a selection of his photos taken on a trip to rural South Africa. His "Small Town Texas" exhibit was displayed at the UTSA Institute of Texan Cultures.

An assortment of his photos were featured in China's most respected photography magazine, Popular Photography. Consequently, Romo recently returned from China where he and four other Texas photographers showed their work in the exhibit "Infinite Horizons: Visions of Texas," initiating a Texas-China cultural exchange program.



Director of Athletics

Lynn Hickey has made student-athlete welfare one of her top priorities as she continues to work to bring the UTSA Athletics Department to the upper echelon of the NCAA Division I standings.

Under Hickey's direction since 2000, UTSA has captured two Southland Conference Commissioner's Cups as the league's top athletics department and two men's and one women's all-sports trophies while consistently winning both team and individual academic and athletics awards in all 17 sports sponsored by the university.

One of Hickey's dreams to lead UTSA to the upper echelon of Division I Athletics was realized on Nov. 11, 2010, when the university received and accepted an invitation to join the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) beginning on July 1, 2012. Hickey's long-term goal of placing UTSA in a major conference was reached when Conference USA extended an invitation on May 4, 2012. The Roadrunners will move all 17 sports into that league on July 1, 2013.

Hickey has overseen the addition of three sports during her tenure. Women's golf and women's soccer were added in 2005 and 2006, respectively, and both programs have emerged as annual league championship contenders. On Dec. 18, 2008, UTSA's Athletics Initiative Business Plan was approved by the UT System Board of Regents, granting permission to start a football program. Hickey made a splash with the hiring of the first-ever head football coach, as two-time National Coach of the Year Larry Coker was introduced on March 6, 2009. The program kicked off its first season against Northeastern State on Sept. 3, 2011, to resounding success. The Roadrunners set NCAA start-up program records for inaugural game (56,743) and average home (35,521) attendance in six games at the 65,000-seat Alamodome.

The 2010-11 academic year will go down in history as arguably the most successful in school annals, as the Roadrunners claimed the Southland Commissioner's Cup and Women's All-Sports Trophy, five championships and the first-ever NCAA postseason victory. UTSA followed that with four more league titles during the 2011-12 campaign, giving the department 36 total championships since 2000-01.

Hickey has led the charge for UTSA and its hosting of numerous NCAA Championship events. Since her arrival on campus, UTSA has served as host institution for the 2001 NCAA Men's Basketball Midwest Regional, 2002 Women's Final Four, 2003 Men's Basketball South Regional, 2004 Men's Final Four, 2005 Women's Volleyball Championship, 2006 Women's Basketball South Regional, 2007 Men's Basketball South Regional, 2008 Men's Final Four, 2010 Women's Final Four, 2011 Men's Basketball Southwest Regional and 2011

Women's Volleyball Championship.

In 2007, Hickey was named to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, one of the most prestigious appointments in all of collegiate athletics. The 10-member committee oversees administration of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship, including the selection and seeding of teams for the tournament. Hickey became just the second female ever selected to the committee, joining UNC Charlotte Athletics Director Judy Rose, who served from 1999-2003.

Hickey has been honored nationally and locally for her hard work at UTSA. She was named the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletics Administrators 2005 Division I-AAA Administrator of the Year. Hickey earned her second national award in June 2006 as the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics/GeneralSports TURF Systems Division I-AAA West Region AD of the Year. The San Antonio Express-News tabbed her as its 2010 Sportswoman of the Year and she also was selected to and completed the Masters Leadership Program of San Antonio and Bexar County. In September 2011, she received the ATHENA Leadership from the North San Antonio Chamber of Commerce.

In serving as the fourth athletics director in UTSA history, Hickey assumed the lead athletics role at one of the youngest NCAA Division I universities in the country (UTSA began athletics competition in 1981). The only female Division I athletics director that oversees both men's and women's sports in the state of Texas, she served as President of the Southland from 2002-04 and as the league's representative to the NCAA Championship/Competition Cabinet. Hickey also was a member of the Women's Basketball Rules Committee from 2003-06, spending the last two years as chair.

Hickey came to San Antonio from Texas A&M University, where she served as senior associate athletics director/senior woman administrator from 1994-2000. At Texas A&M, her responsibilities included event management and marketing and promotions for 16 of the university's 19 Division I sports. She also represented the Big 12 Conference as a member of the NCAA Championship Cabinet.

From 1984-94, Hickey served as head women's basketball coach for Texas A&M. She directed the 1993-94 Aggies basketball team to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, becoming the lowest-seeded team to ever reach that milestone. Texas A&M finished the year ranked No. 19 in the CNN/USA Today Top 25 poll. Following the season, Hickey relinquished her coaching duties to accept the promotion to senior associate athletics director. She finished her coaching career with an overall mark of 279-167 in 15 years of collegiate coaching.

Before her stint at A&M, Hickey was head women's basketball coach at Kansas State University from 1979-84. She averaged more than 23 wins per season in posting a 125-39 (.762) record over five years and led the Wildcats to five consecutive national tournament berths. She was inducted into the Kansas State Athletics Hall of Fame in September 2004.

A native of Welch, Okla., Hickey graduated summa cum laude from Ouachita Baptist University in Arkadelphia, Ark., with a bachelor's degree in education. She was an All-American for OBU's nationally-ranked basketball team and a member of the USA National Team in 1973. Hickey and her husband, Bill, have one daughter, Lauren Nicole.

Monica Gibbs

On Nov. 21, 2010, Monica Gibbs became the first UTSA women's basketball player to have her jersey retired. The Stillwater, Okla., native helped guide the Roadrunners to a pair of 20-win seasons, including a school-record 24 wins in her senior campaign of 2008-09. She helped UTSA produce back-to-back Southland Conference Tournament Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time. In 2009, the Roadrunners became the first No. 15-seed in the history of the NCAA Women's Division I Tournament to push a No. 2-seed to overtime, eventually falling to Baylor 87-82.

She owns UTSA career records for assists (693), rebounds (990), games played (123) and games started (113) and the single-season record for assists (221/2008-09).

Gibbs is one of just six players in program history with 1,000 points and 500 rebounds and the only player to top 1,400 points and 900 rebounds.

In addition to her impact on the UTSA record books, Gibbs earned several Southland accolades. In 2006 she became the third player in program history to be named the league's Freshman of the Year after averaging 7.3 points, 7.1 rebounds and 4.9 assists per contest.

Gibbs was named second-team all-conference as a sophomore before finishing her career as a first teamer in 2008 and 2009. In addition, after leading UTSA to its first Southland Tournament crown in 2008, she was named the event's Most Valuable Player. Gibbs became the first player in league history to be named both the Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2009 and helped lead the Roadrunners to their second straight tournament title.
